School Parental Involvement Policy

Part I: General Expectations

 - a. School Site Council Meetings
 - b. Parent-Teacher Conferences
 - c. School Board Meetings
 - d. Title I Annual Meetings
 - e. ELAC/DLAC Meetings

Part III: Shared Responsibilities for High Student Academic Achievement

Kit Carson will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development and joint agreement of its School Parental Involvement Policy and its schoolwide plan:

- 1. *Kit Carson* will build the schools' and parent's capacity for strong parental involvement, in order to ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, through the following activities specifically described below:
